THE PSLE REMAINS AS A USEFUL CHECKPOINT

- The PSLE is a useful checkpoint at the end of primary school to help students, parents and teachers determine where each child's academic strengths lie.
- It guides students to a suitable academic programme and subject levels in secondary school – one that best suits their learning needs. In this way, students can learn and progress at a comfortable pace.
- The PSLE result also serves as a fair and transparent mechanism to determine secondary school posting.

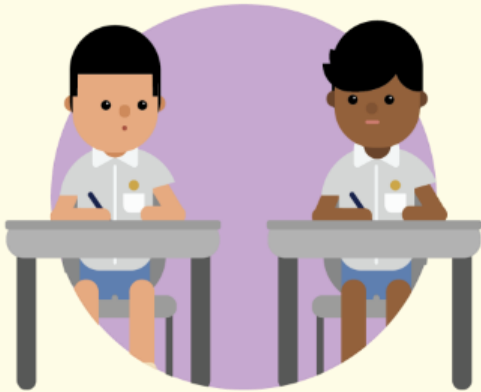

THE PSLE CHANGES ARE PART OF A BIGGER STORY

Over the years, we have been fine-tuning the education system to help our students discover and develop their strengths and interests, while moving away from an over-emphasis on academic results. Our PSLE Scoring changes aim to reduce an **over-emphasis on academic results** by:



Reducing fine differentiation of students' examination results at a young age



Recognising a student's level of achievement, regardless of how his/her peers have done



Offering students and parents a wider range of secondary schools to explore

CHOICE ORDER OF SCHOOLS WILL MATTER MORE

- Students continue to have **six choices** in selecting their secondary schools.
- Students will be posted to a secondary school based on **academic merit, i.e. PSLE Score**, and their **school choice rank order**.
- If two students with the same PSLE Score vie for the last remaining place in a school, the following tie-breakers will be used in the following order:
 1. **CITIZENSHIP**
 2. **CHOICE ORDER OF SCHOOLS** **NEW!**
 3. **COMPUTERISED BALLOTING**
- The new tie-breaker based on school choice order recognises the different considerations that families have in making school choices.

➤ Students with better scores will be posted first

Jane has a better PSLE score. She will be posted first, to **School A**.





➤ Tie-breaker #1: Citizenship

Bryan, Mary, Alan and Rina have the same score.

As Jane has taken the last available place in School A, Bryan, Mary, Alan and Rina will vie for the last available place in their next choice, **School B**.


Bryan and Mary are Singapore Citizens. They will have priority to enter **School B**.




Alan and Rina will be tie-broken out as they are Permanent Residents. They will be considered for their next choice, **School D**.

➤ Tie-breaker #2: Choice order of schools

Because Bryan ranked School B higher than Mary, he will be posted to **School B**.




Since Bryan has taken the last place in School B, Mary will be posted to **School C**.




Alan and Rina have both ranked School D as their third choice. They will go through computerised balloting to vie for the last remaining place in **School D**.

➤ Tie-breaker #3: Computerised balloting

Through computerised balloting, Alan is posted to **School D**.



Since Alan has taken the last place in School D, Rina will be posted to her fourth choice, **School E**.

Pupils Who Qualify for N(T) Course

- can also apply to Crest Secondary School (CSS) and Spectra Secondary School (SSS)
- CSS and SSS offer an alternative educational pathway for pupils eligible for the N(T) course who have an interest in practice-oriented, hands-on learning.
- As CSS and SSS do not participate in S1 Posting Exercise, **pupils are to apply directly to CSS and SSS**. Interested pupils should refer to the Letter of Invitation and Application Form or the schools' website (CSS: www.crestsec.edu.sg; SSS: www.spectra.edu.sg) for more details of the application process and timeline).

In 2022, greater range of activities will resume (e.g. higher risk CCA activities, level assemblies) for the vast majority of vaccinated students in secondary schools.

Schools will be required to implement modified Vaccination-Differentiated Safe Management Measures (VDS) from Jan 2022 onwards.

You are encouraged to get your child/ward vaccinated once they are of age and are eligible.



Appeal for Transfer

- Appeals will **only** be considered on exceptional basis for students with:
 - Serious medical conditions, such as chronic heart conditions or kidney problems.
 - Dyslexia or Autism Spectrum Disorder.
 - Severe physical disabilities, such as those requiring permanent use of a wheelchair.
- All appeals must be accompanied by relevant supporting documents, such as medical reports, letters from doctors.
- Appeals can be filed at your child's posted secondary school **on the next day after the posting results have been released.**
- The staff at your child's posted secondary school will help to file your appeal.
- Students seeking transfers should continue to attend their posted secondary school until their transfer is approved.
