CHOICE ORDER OF SCHOOLS WILL MATTER MORE

- Students continue to have six choices in selecting their secondary schools.
- Students will be posted to a secondary school based on <u>academic merit, i.e. PSLE Score</u>, and their <u>school choice rank order</u>.
- If two students with the same PSLE Score vie for the last remaining place in a school, the following tiebreakers will be used in the following order:
 - 1. CITIZENSHIP
 - 2. CHOICE ORDER OF SCHOOLS
 - 3. COMPUTERISED BALLOTING
- The new tie-breaker based on school choice order recognises the different considerations that families have in making school choices.

via S1 Posting Exercise

- Singapore Sports School (SSP)
- To apply for mainstream schools via S1 posting exercise
- Pupils may then transfer to SSP after the S1 posting results are released. This is to ensure they can return to their posted school if they subsequently need to leave SSP due to extenuating circumstances.

Non-participating Schools

via Direct Application

- Crest Secondary School (CSS) (located in Jurong East)
- Spectra Secondary School (SSS) (located in Woodlands)
- Pupils **must** participate in the S1 posting process to ensure that they are posted to a secondary school in case their SSNT application is unsuccessful.
- If pupils' application are successful, they will be informed by the respective SSNT and they will not be posted to another school through S1 Posting.

Pupils Who Qualify for N(T) Course

- will be given an invitation package to apply to Crest Secondary School (CSS) and Spectra Secondary School (SSS)
- CSS and SSS offer an alternative educational pathway for pupils eligible for the N(T) course who have an interest in practiceoriented, hands-on learning.
- As mentioned earlier, CSS and SSS do not participate in S1
 Posting Exercise, pupils are to apply directly to CSS and SSS.

Reporting to School

You are to check the school's website, to find out details for:

Reporting (when school reopens in January).



- Students and parents familiarisation.
- Purchase of new uniforms and textbooks.

Your child should report to the posted secondary school when school reopens in January, even if you intend to appeal for a transfer.

Appeal for Transfer

- Appeals will only be considered on exceptional basis for students with:
 - Serious medical conditions, such as chronic heart conditions or kidney problems.
 - Dyslexia or Autism Spectrum Disorder.
 - Severe physical disabilities, such as those requiring permanent use of a wheelchair.
- All appeals must be accompanied by relevant supporting documents, such as medical reports, letters from doctors.
- Appeals can be filed at your child's posted secondary school on the next day after the posting results have been released.
- The staff at your child's posted secondary school will help to file your appeal.
- Students seeking transfers should continue to attend their posted secondary school until their transfer is approved.

Secondary 5 Option for 2023 S1 Cohort as part of Full Subject Based Banding (SBB)

Question: For students entering Sec 1 N(A) in 2023, will they have the option to take Sec 5 in 2027 under Full SBB (i.e. first year of SEC national exam)?

The option of a 5th year will continue to be available for students entering Sec 1 N(A) in 2023. Students will sit for the GCE N-Level examination in 2026 and those who are eligible for and wish to take up the 5th year in 2027 can do so. They will then sit for the common national examination, the Singapore-Cambridge Secondary Education Certificate (SEC) in 2027.
